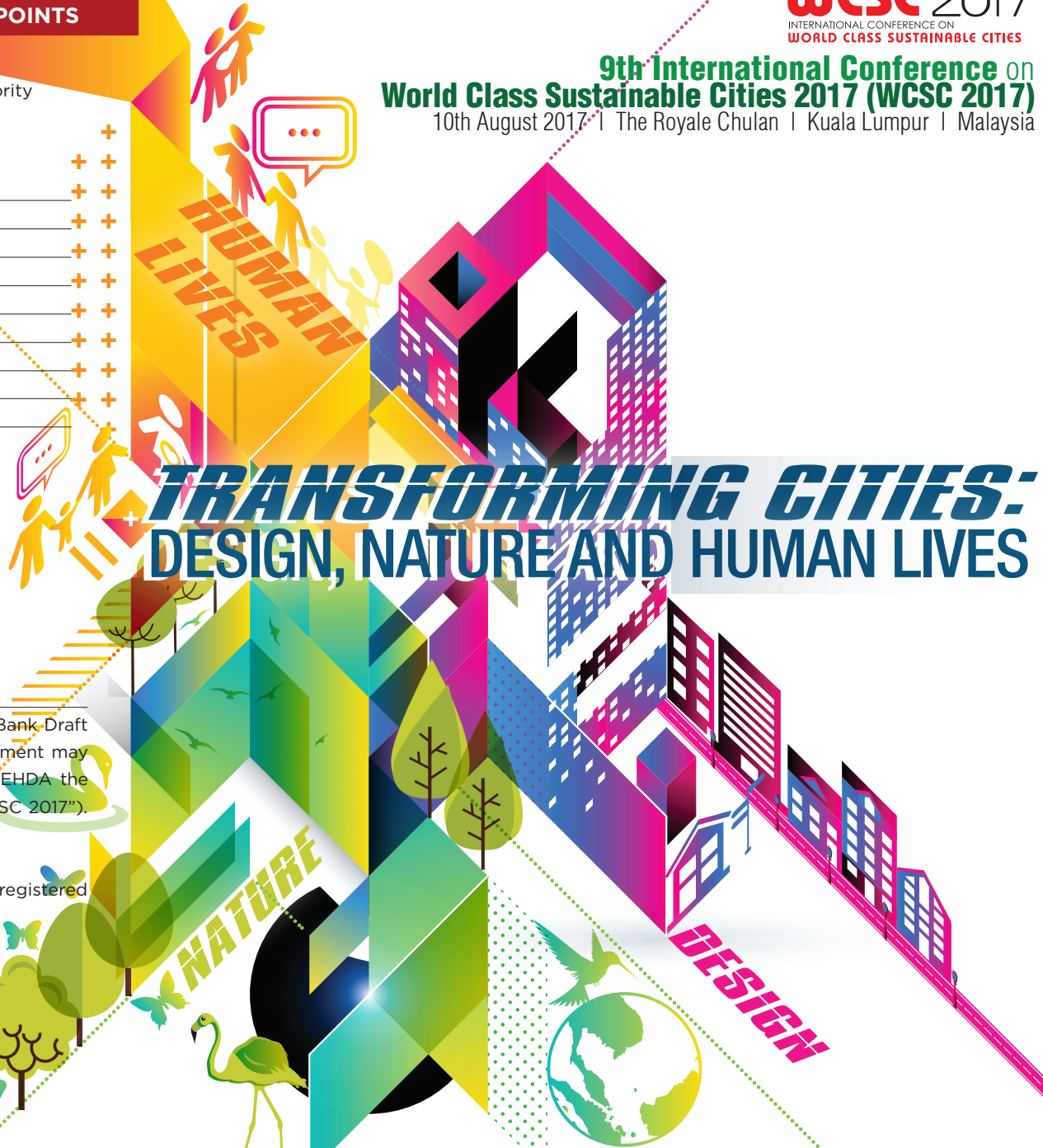

## BACKGROUND

The 21st Century is a century of cities. Already more than half of the world's population lives in cities, and according to the United Nations, by 2050 this is expected to reach 66 percent, when 2.5 billion people will be added to urban populations. *Mayor of Bandung, Indonesia*

**Keynote : The Transformation of Bandung – Challenges & Outcomes**

Mochamad Ridwan Kamil (born 1971) or known by his nickname Emil, is the incumbent Mayor of Bandung. He was elected as mayor of Bandung on 23 June 2013. He is an Indonesian architect and lecturer in the Department of Architecture, Bandung Institute of Technology. Emil founded architect firm Urbane Indonesia in 2004 with three partners. He studied architecture at the Bandung Institute of Technology, and continued to study for a Master of Urban Design at the College of Environmental Design, University of California, Berkeley.

In 2006, Emil was the Indonesian winner of the British Council's Young Creative Entrepreneur award, representing Indonesia in the International Young Design Entrepreneur of the Year award. In 2009, Emil was selected as the Architect of the Year by Elle Decor magazine. He was the pioneer of the Indonesia Berkebun movement to build amateur gardens in the cities of Indonesia. As of 2011 the community project is established in fourteen cities in Indonesia, with membership approaching 4000.
